### **ENROLL IN FACE TODAY**

We are now enrolling for the Salt River FACE program. We have two programs to choose from:

- Home Base for families with children ages 0-3
- Early Childhood
   Preschool for 3/4 yr olds

Family And Child Education (FACE) is an early enrichment program at Salt River Elementary School that focuses on parent and child engagement, child development, and early literacy.

Enrollment is open to any family of any federally recognized tribe, living within a 15-mile radius of SRPMIC (they do not have to live within the Community).

Winter Break is not a time for worksheets and textbooks, but your child should continue to learn. The best way is just to read a little bit every day. And that means reading more than text messages! Here's how:

- Link movies to books. Your child, like many others, may enjoy watching movies during winter break. Encourage them to watch at least one based on a bookand read the book first.
- Give books for gifts. If your child will receive a gift this month, consider giving them a book or a gift card to a bookstore. Suggest this to other family members as well.
- Read for a purpose. Practical reading--the kind you do to learn a skill--is both
  fun and informative. If your child enjoys cooking, they could read a recipe and
  try it out. If they like gadgets, they could read the instruction manual and put
  one together. If they likes sports, they could check out the newspaper for a

Congratulations to the following student and family, who will be recognized at the Dec. 4 Education Board meeting:


